Brisbane Metro – a key part of Brisbane's greater transport network

Council is building a greater transport network to help you get from the city to the suburbs quicker and safer.

New high-capacity and high-frequency Brisbane Metro services will run along dedicated busways and link with suburban bus and train services as part of a better planned network. That means more buses available for the suburbs and less bus congestion in the city. You'll get home up to 50% quicker, so you can do more of what you love. 
